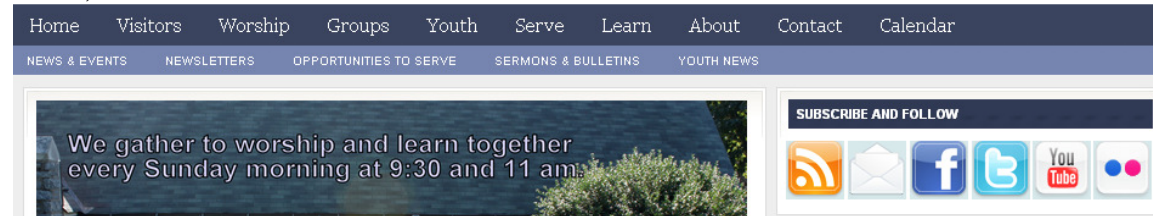


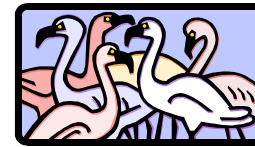
***SUBSCRIBE TO THE CHURCH WEBSITE AND DON'T MISS OUT
ON ANY UPDATES***

The church website (www.wallingfordpres.org) has been updated to allow readers to easily subscribe to it. Once you become a subscriber, all new announcements, e.g. snow closings, new classes, rescheduled Sprouts events, etc. will be sent to you automatically, so you won't have to go looking for the information. Log onto the church website and click on the icon in the upper right, under the heading Subscribe and Follow, that is for the way you want to receive the info. You have a choice of RSS feed (for the techies), email, facebook or twitter. Just click on the icon and follow the instructions.



Please note that email updates are sent out one time per day at approximately 3 PM eastern time. All other accounts are updated real time. So...if an announcement such as a snow closing is made after 3 PM, and you are an email subscriber, you will not get the email until 3 PM the following day. LITURGIST TEAM TO BEGIN! MARCH 10, 7:30PM – What's a liturgist you ask? And, what, pray tell, would a team of them be?! The Worship Council of session is putting out this call to any and all, readers to age 100+ who would like to have a part in leading worship. Each quarter this team of worship leaders will gather to overview the scripture lessons that will be the focus of worship in the weeks ahead and accept assignments to read the text on particular Sundays and to prepare prayers for the day. When we gather we'll practice using the microphone, projecting, and expression. We'll learn about public prayer and the background of the texts that will be offered. Sometimes the team may even do some reading work together! If you like to lead, want to learn some about worship and have a part in building the worship experience, join us for the first meeting of the Liturgist Team on March 10, 7:30pm. Oh, and by the way, a liturgist is one who "uses and advocates the use of liturgical forms"...in short, someone who uses the verbal forms and elements of worship to lead the people in glorifying God! Oh, and a "team"? This will just be a gaggle of fun!



Flamingo Flocking began February 13th!!!

The flock of flamingos has returned to Wallingford, PA! You have the opportunity to flock one of your neighbors or loved ones in support of the WPC high school youth group. We have over 60 pink plastic flamingos, each about 2 feet high. For \$3/bird, the WPC high schoolers will place as many birds as you would like in the yard of your choosing. The birds will be placed the night before you want them found, along with a sign saying they are from the WPC youth group and will be removed in two days. Two nights later the youth will return and take the birds away. Nothing says "I care about you" like filling someone's yard with tasteful lawn ornaments!

This is the first high school youth event raising funds for their two trips this summer: one to Montreat, North Carolina, and the other to Isom, Kentucky. At Montreat, they will join over 1,000 other high school students worshipping, singing, dancing, learning about God, and playing games together. At Isom, they will work with SWAP (Sharing With Appalachian People) to rebuild and repair homes for low-income families living in that part of the Appalachia.
